
Our Karnataka is the rhythm of our hearts, the melody that binds us, and the heritage that shapes who we are.



Our Karnataka teaches us unity, culture, and compassion, and through this celebration, we felt more connected than ever to our roots.







Hands-On Science: From Lamps to Eclipses!




Grade 6 Shines Light on Eclipses!

They discovered how light travels straight and how shadows create these amazing celestial events!




Students explored rectilinear propagation of light and recreated solar and lunar eclipses using lamps, balls, and screens.

Our Grade 7 students stepped into the fascinating world where science feels like magic—the world of magnetism and electric current.




They built electromagnets, watching ordinary iron nails transform into powerful magnets the moment electric current flowed through their wires.



They also created electric bells, and electric compasses, discovering how electric current can produce powerful, invisible forces. Each experiment showed them how electricity and magnetism work together in devices.







NURSERY FARM FUN!

Growing Through Play: A Multisensory Learning Moment




This activity touched multiple learning goals at once—sensory, motor, emotional, and social—making it a truly meaningful experience for our little learners.

RED DAY: SPLASH OF BRIGHT JOY


Our tiny tots from Nursery celebrated Red Day with excitement, laughter, and a burst of bright colour!

Each dance set the mood for the story that was about to unfold. The rhythmic beats, coordinated movements, and expressive gestures that drew everyone into the world of Mahabharata.





